BOOKING REQUIRED
BOOKING REQUIRED. NO DOGS PLEASE.PLEASE NOTE EARLIER START TIME - 9.00 PROMPT. Snake path, Twenty Trees, Shooting Lodge, to the base of William Clough. Then a steep 900 feet ascent to Kinder Plateau, Kinder Downfall, Kinder Trig point, base of Brown Knoll, down and over South Head, to the base of Chinley Chun, down into the Sett Valley, up on to Lantern Pike, down into Little Hayfield, through Park Hall, towards the Shooting Lodges and back down to Hayfield via Twenty Trees. Risk assessment: This walk is long and strenuous so a high level of fitness is required. Some rough terrain so boots essential. Can be muddy. Crossing streams. Crossing A624 road twice, so care needed. A small amount of road walking. Escape routes in place if required. Bring extra food and drink, including, I suggest, 2 litres of water.
BOOKING REQUESTED. From the Cat and Fiddle the path leads north, then northwesterly to Shining Tor. We retrace our steps to the path leading easterly towards Goyt's Moss. Then south crossing the A537 to join the Dane Valley Way over Axe Edge moor and Orchard Common. Across the A54 then following a moorland path back to the Cat and Fiddle. Risk assessment: Two crossings of the A537, and one of the less busy A54. Mainly moorland walking, paths may be uneven and muddy. Some stiles.
BOOKING REQUIRED. NO DOGS PLEASE.A steady climb of 1200 feet out of Hayfield to Edale Cross via Tunstead Clough and Kinderlow End. Then across to Brown Knoll and on to Rushup Edge. Then we follow the Pennine Bridleway back to Hayfield via South Head and Highgate. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots not shoes needed. Can be muddy. Sheep and cattle in fields. Some stiles (including one tall ladder). Escape routes in place if required.
BOOKING REQUESTED. NO DOGS PLEASE. Climb via the Nab to Ringing Roger then past Grindsbrook Clough, Pym Chair and Swine's Back to Brown Knoll. Descending via Whitmore Clough to Dale Head and returning to the car park by Barber Booth. Risk assessment: Care on uneven, rocky ground.

BOOKING REQUIRED, MAX. 12 WALKERS. We head west from the car park to eventually join the Limestone Way towards Miller's Dale. Then we follow the River Wye to Litton Mill and then Cressbrook Mill. We ascend a steep road to Cressbrook Dale, descending to a footbridge and again ascending steep terrain to fine views over the river. Then drop into Tansley Dale and ascend to cross fields into the charming village of Litton, from where a quiet road leads back to the centre of Tideswell. Risk assessment: Some walking along minor roads. Two crossings of main roads. Some steep and rocky terrain with drops to one side which could be hazardous in wet weather. Some steep stone stiles.
BOOKING REQUESTED. 500 feet of initial ascent over four fifths of a mile to Lockerbrook. Then continuing west to the Castles via a slabbed path over Rowlee Pasture to lunch at The Tower at 1750 feet. Descent to Alport Farm, south to Upper Ashop, then east via woodland paths to climb again via Hagg Farm back to cars. Risk assessment: crossing the A57 twice and a steepish descent from the Castles. Don't go near the edge! Wonderful high level views but may have to be curtailed in bad weather.
BOOKING REQUIRED. NO DOGS PLEASE. We leave Castleton Visitor Centre and head up Cave Dale and then on to Mam Tor. Along the Great Ridge, then dropping down from Lose Hill into Hope and following the river back into Castleton. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots required. Can be muddy in places. A small amount of road walking.
BOOKING REQUIRED. Eastward from village to cross Deep Dale to Sheldon, then Monyash via Magpie Mine. Head north-west to Flagg and Chelmorton, east to cross Taddington Moor and return. Risk assessment: Could be wet and muddy with livestock present, particularly as there are many fields to cross with some stiles. Some road walking. Overall no serious obstacles. Poor visibility may be the main challenge.
BOOKING REQUIRED. NO DOGS PLEASE. Elle Bank, Stones House, Higher Hayes Farm, Hills Farm, down into Birch Vale. Head on to Little Hayfield, Park Hall Estate, then pick up the Snake path back to Hayfield. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots required, will be muddy in places, a small amount of road walking. We cross the busy A624 twice.

BOOKING REQUESTED.
BOOKING REQUESTED. Tideswell toward Litton skirting to the south across fields and tracks descending into Cressbrook Dale. A steady climb to Wardlow Mires and on to Great and Little Hucklow returning to Tideswell via Tideslow rake. Risk assessment: Reasonable footing along tracks. There are some roads and lanes to navigate but generally good walking surfaces.
BOOKING REQUIRED. SORRY NO DOGS. Starting from Hayfield we head along the Sett Valley Trail, The Torrs (New Mills), Hague Bar, Brook Bottom, Roman Lakes, Marple Bridge, Brabyns Park, up on to the canal over the viaduct then down into Chadkirk. Then catching the hourly 358 bus back to Hayfield. (Please note, due to time restrictions no café or pub stops on route). Risk assessment: May be muddy in places; small amount of road walking.
BOOKING REQUIRED. SORRY NO DOGS. We start by walking along the Pennine Bridleway via the Sett Valley Trail, Lantern Pike, Butcher’s Piece Farm and on to Cown Edge. Then returning to Hayfield via Rowarth and Thornsett Brows. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots needed. May be Muddy in places. Small amount of road walking.
BOOKING REQUESTED. Descent from village to the river Bradford walking along its southern edge to turn south and ascend gently across fields to the head of Longdale. Climbing out of the eastern end to a short walk along a road before turning northeast across several fields for over a mile before reaching the village of Elton. Again, crossing fields to a track that leads to Robin Hoods Stride a local landmark. A meandering course is taken to Alport village close to the confluence of rivers Bradford and Lathkill. Heading west along the Bradford River path we eventually climb back up to the car park. Risk assessment: Cattle may be present. The route is relatively easy under foot, no physical obstacles. As always weather is the determining factor.

BOOKING REQUIRED. Rowarth to Lantern Pike (highest point is optional) with views of Kinder in good weather, then north via the Pennine Bridleway and Matley Moor. Across fields to Herod Edge Farm, crossing Monk’s Road and ascending to the Cown Edge Way where again we should have good views if clear. South along Cown Edge via Far Cown Edge Farm to Rowarth. Risk assessment: Some steady ascents. May be muddy in places if wet. Caution crossing Monks Road. May be a few cattle on Matley Moor.
BOOKING REQUIRED. SORRY, NO DOGS. We head for Little Hayfield, then up on to Lantern Pike, along the Pennine Bridleway to Sett Valley. Up on to the base of Chinley Churn, then up and over South Head, past the base of Brown Knowle, Kinder trig point, Swines Back and Edale Cross. Then back down to Hayfield via Broad Clough. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots needed. Can be muddy, crossing A624 twice so care needed, small amount of road walking. Due to extra distance, bring extra food and drink.

BOOKING REQUIRED. SORRY, NO DOGS. Snake Path, Twenty Trees, Shooting Lodge, to the base of William Clough. Steep 900 feet ascent to Kinder Plateau, Kinder Downfall, Kinder trig point, base of Brown Knowle, over South Head, to the base of Chinley Churn. Down into the Sett Valley, up on to Lantern Pike, down into Little Hayfield, through Park Hall and back down to Hayfield via Twenty Trees. Risk assessment: This walk is long and strenuous so a high level of fitness is required. Some rough terrain so boots needed. Can be muddy, crossing streams, crossing A624 three times so care needed, small amount of road walking. Extra food and drink required, which suggest includes 2 litres of water.
BOOKING REQUIRED. A scenic circuit of the plateau of Combs Moss, a grouse moor overlooking Buxton. On a clear day the view stretches from the hills north of Manchester to the Cat and Fiddle and beyond in the south. Risk assessment: One steep ascent shortly after the start of the walk and one steep different descent at the end.
BOOKING REQUIRED. SORRY NO DOGS. From the car park we head for the start of the Pennine Way, then through Upper Booth, up Jacobs Ladder to the trig point on Kinder Scout. Down past Swine's Back to Edale Cross. Along to Brown Knowle, then on towards Rushup Edge then down Chapel Gate to Edale. Risk assessment: Rough terrain in parts so boots needed, can be muddy, a small amount of road walking.
BOOKING REQUIRED A walk down three tranquil limestone dales in the White Peak finishing on a stretch of the High Peak Trail, a route planned as a canal, built as railway. Risk assessment: A5012 is crossed twice and there is a small amount of walking on quiet country roads.
BOOKING REQUIRED, SORRY NO DOGSLeaving Rainow we make a sharp ascent up to Lamaload reservoir onto Jenkin Chapel located just below Pym Chair via Redmoor Farm. Return via ascent of Cook Hill back to Rainow
From Hayfield we walk along the Sett Valley trail and then ascend up to Lantern Pike. From that viewpoint we descend, cross the A624 and over Middle Moor and towards Kinder Reservoir, then down to Kinder Road. Then ascend to skirt Mount Famine, re-cross the A624 and up past Peep O'Day and back towards Hayfield. Risk assessment: open moorland walking and ascent, optional steep climb to the top of Lantern Pike. Farm land with possible cattle/sheep. Cross the A624 twice.

NO DOGS. This varied circuit in the White Peak crosses open countryside from the attractive village of Ashford in the Water following the babbling River Wye taking in stunning vistas, water features and a Scheduled Monument. Risk assessment: footpaths are narrow in places and the drop back down into Ashford in the Water is quite steep for a short stretch.
NO DOGS. An airy route through the lesser-walked countryside south-west of Castleton. Old mining tracks and back lanes meander amid rolling hilly limestone pastureland, with a wealth of grand vistas. The Pennine Bridleway then leads to a ridge walk finish along Rushup Edge, with stunning views. Risk assessment: there is some road walking on quiet roads and we cross the busy main road twice.
West from station across the river Wye, south toward Priestcliffe, east to High Dale. Eventually descending to the Wye again before crossing the river and ascending to Monsal Head. Returning via Cressbrook and Litton Mill. Risk assessment: cattle and mud may be in evidence
BOOKING REQUIRED, NO DOGS. Steady climb of 1200 feet out of Hayfield to Edale Cross via Tunstead Clough and Kinderlow End. Then across to Brown Knoll and on to Rushup Edge. Then we follow the Pennine Bridleway back to Hayfield via South Head and Highgate. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots not shoes needed. Can be muddy, sheep in fields. Some stiles including one tall ladder stile.
BOOKING REQUIRED, MAX. 18 WALKERS DUE TO LIMITED PARKING. The walk descends the valley to the south east of Axe Moor (gritstone) before summiting (for the adventurous) or skirting (for the prudent) Chrome Hill (limestone) and returning via the village of Hollinsclough and Brand End. Risk assessment: good paths, some stiles but can be wet and muddy between Hollinsclough and Brand End.
BOOKING REQUIRED, NO DOGS. Snake Path, Twenty Trees, shooting lodge, to the base of William Clough. Steep ascent of 900 feet onto Kinder Plateau, Kinder Downfall then on to Kinder trig point. We then descend via Edale Cross and the Roman Road back to Hayfield. Risk assessment: Rough terrain so boots not shoes needed. Can be muddy in places. Stream crossing required and a short element of road walking.

Plantation Edge over Cock Hill to join Pennine Way at Torside Clough. Cross Sykes Moor to L1476 site then on to Wain Stones. Visit B-29 site then over Shelf Moor to identify the site of the memorial to KB993 and C-47 before descending Little Clough to Doctors Gate for the walk back to Old Glossop. Risk assessment: open moorland, no major roads or obstacles to negotiate.
BOOKING REQUIRED, MAX. 15 WALKERS. From car park, cross to Windgather Rocks before steep descent through plantation and up again over Taxal Moor towards Fernilee Reservoir and continuing to Errwood Dam. Lunch at ruins of Erwood Hall before a steady ascent past the Spanish Shrine and back to Pym Chair. Risk assessment: very windy weather would result in cancellation as we walk through forestry. Three crossings of minor roads, one steepish stile, some slightly rocky but clearly marked paths.
Descending into Bradford Dale, eventually heading south toward Gratton Moor and Long Dale across fields toward Elton village. Heading north between Robin Hoods Stride and the Hermits Cave to Alton and west back along the river to the start. Risk assessment: There may be cattle in some fields. No significant obstacles to navigate.
Walk down Arden Road at the side of the Arden Arms and on to Turner Lane, then down to the River Tame, past the kennels and climb up steps to the Peak Forest canal. Follow the canal through Hyde and then off the canal to re-join the River Tame. We then follow the river, crossing Manchester Road then later Mill Lane into Haughton Dale Nature Reserve, where we follow the river to Beight Bridge. Then back across a bridge back to the Arden Arms.
To Hartington passing by Vincent House and Carder Low, then via Biggin Dale to Dale Head and Heathcote, returning via Hartington Meadows and the Pennine Bridleway.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY - Starting from opposite the station we ascend to Todbrook Reservoir through Horwich End and Taxal to Crow Hill on tracks. Then over Taxal Edge and down to Kettleshulme. On to Whaley Moor past the dipping stones and down to Whaley Bridge. Tracks, fields and a dozen stiles on route.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY - From the mill heading south along the Manifold Way towards Beeston Tor, then south to Throwley Moor, west to the hamlet of Waterfall and north to Grindon and Butterton before descending to the mill.

PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY - An airy route through the lesser-walked countryside SW of Castleton. Old mining tracks and back lanes through hilly limestone pastureland, with grand vistas. The Pennine Bridleway leads to a ridge walk along Rushup Edge with stunning views.
Field path via Barber Booth and Upper Booth to the Pennine Way, then following the ridge path to Ringing Roger for descent into Edale via the Nab.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY - max 20 walkers. Descend to the River Goyt which we follow through New Mills, then via the Peak Forest Canal to Furness Vale. Ascend up street, then through farm fields and eventually up road to Bowstones where we enter Lyme Park. Descend through Lantern Wood and Green Lane to Disley, where we rejoin the canal towpath to Redhouse Lane on the way to the car park.
Doctor's Gate to Plantation Edge then climbing via Shelf Moss to Bleaklow Head, returning via Hern Stones and the B29 crash site.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. Climb out of the village via Highgate Road and bridleway to Peep-O-Day and Hills Farm. Head east along top of Cracken Edge below Throstle Bank to Overhill Road. Climb up towards Foxholes Clough and down to cross the Sett Valley, then up to Little Hayfield. Passing Park Hall, ascent to Middle Moor, picking up the bridleway to descend and return below Kinder Bank and Kinder Road to the start.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. From car park over the Goyt Valley ridge into the Combs Valley, down to Combs village, then ascent up onto and along Combs Ridge back to Goyt Valley.
A stiff path and final scramble up Grindsbrook Clough then over to Kinder Downfall, returning via Jacob's Ladder and Upper Booth
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. South from Hartington towards Alstonefield via Beresford Dale and Narrowdale. West to Wetton village then heading north west to ascend Ecton Hill before a steepish descent to the Manifold Valley. We then follow the trail to Hulme End and continue across fields back to the start.

Footpaths are narrow in places and the drop back down into Ashford-in-the-Water is quite steep for a short stretch.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. Limestone Way across fields, then return along the valley of Lathkill Dale.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLYA slow diagonal ascent up the Great Ridge to Hollins Cross, then along the ridge towards Back Tor before descending to and crossing Townhead Bridge, Hope. Ascent up to Roman Road and Hope Cross, return down Edale Valley after ford at Jagers Clough.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. Starting along the pretty northern banks of Torside reservoir to the village of Tintwistle then commencing a 1000 foot reasonably gradual ascent of Arnfield Moor up to Millstone Rocks (more popularly known to walkers as 'Lad's Leap') at 1650 feet, then east to Highstone Rocks and picking up part of the Pennine Way back to cars.

Snake path-Kinder reservoir-Upper House-Broad Clough-beneath Kinder Low End-Edale X-South Head-Mt Famine-Elle bank -Valley Rd-car park. Route heavily depends on possible snow drifts!
The walk descends the valley to the south east of Axe Moor (Gritstone) before summiting (for the adventurous) or skirting (for the prudent) Chrome Hill (Limestone) and returning via the village of Hollinsclough and Brand End. Good paths, some stiles but can be wet and muddy between Hollinsclough and Brand End.
Pennine Way to Soldiers Lump on top of Black Hill [1,900 feet] then returning over Tooleyshaw Moor.
West out of station then south to Blackwell and Priestcliffe, east to connect with Monsal Dale then north toward Cresbrook back to Millers Dale via Litton Mill.
From the station we cross Monks Dale, then follow the Limestone way to Dale head. Back towards Hargatewall and Wormhill. Down to the Wye valley and along Chee Dale with 2 sets of stepping stones and a little scrambling or an easy walk back along the Monsal Trail.
Monyash, Limestone way, Over Haddon, Lathkill Dale, Monyash.

Beginning on the Sett Valley Trail, we then walk up to Lantern Pike and across to Cown Edge, passing through the village of Rowarth and over the ridge back to Hayfield.
Snake path to base of William Clough; around eastern edge of reservoir above Upper House; heading south to below Kinder Low End then east to Edale Cross (Can be a tiring climb). A slabbed walk to South Head (A steep ascent on South Head) across to Mount Famine-a ridge walk requiring care; eventually descending to Valley Road, Hayfield.

We'll then follow the trail Westwards, sometimes following other footpaths, before leaving the trail to drop down into Chee Dale, which is a dramatic, deep sided gorge, along quite an exciting and interesting path, but which can be difficult in wet conditions. We'll climb out of the Dale at a dramatic bridge between two tunnels, and follow the trail back to the car park at Topley Pike.

Start Point; Miller's Dale station, Derbyshire SK17 8SN. (Approximate only - postcode covers large area). Miller's Dale is on the B6049 which runs between the A6 at the Southwest end and the A623 at the northeast. A splendid walk following the Monks Dale valley floor, before joining the Limestone Way along a quiet road and footpath field crossings to Tideswell village and down the lane to Litton. Then crossing farmland fields before dropping into Tansley Dale, onto Cressbrook Dale following the stream through the trees and river to Water-cum-Jolly Dale before joining the Monsal Trail through Millers Dale back to the car park. Total ascent 436m 1431ft
Start Point; Park in the lay-by on A5004 Whaley Bridge to Buxton Road (1 mile south of Whaley Bridge and east of Taxal) SK 008799 SK23 7DY JX (rough guide only, postcode covers a large area)The route initially drops and then rises steeply through farmland, upland fields and moorland paths towards Taxal Moor then crossing heath/open moorland via paved/good paths to Edge before descending to woodland paths and grassland along the River Goyt, back to the car park. Total ascents 361m 1184ft
SK17 6SU Warning; This, the nearest, post code is on the A5004 above and a mile East of the reservoir. This walk takes in forest, grit stone edge, moorland ridge and secluded woodland valley. Ascent 500m 1,641 ft
Start Point; Hathersage station approach S32 1DTA walk to discover the historic Bole Hill quarries, the stone from which was used to construct the Derwent Valley dams. The area is now covered in mature Silver Birch trees, and is a pleasure to walk through. From Hathersage, we will follow the Derwent Valley Heritage Way along the river, to Padley. From there we will climb the incline, which was used to lower stone from the quarries to the main railway line, en-route to the sites at the Derwent dams. From there, we will climb to Stanage Edge, passing Mother Cap and Higger Tor, before dropping down again to Hathersage, passing through the churchyard, for a look at Little Johns grave.

Start Point; Turn off the Snake Road A57 towards Fairholmes (left turn before the bridge), the 1st car park marked on the OS OL1 map, just past the Crookhill Farm drive. Up through Crookhill Farm heading through upland fields and moorland towards Alport Castles. Then drop down towards Alport Castles Farm and walking along the track towards the Snake Road, crossing over the river and heading up heath to Hope Cross, down through the forest, re-crossing the river and Snake Road and climbing back towards Lockerbrook Farm, before making our way back to the start. Total accents 782m 2565ft
Start Point; Hadfield station car park SK13 2AO. This is the 2nd of walks along the Pennine way we travel from Hadfield to Glossop using the frequent train service. Then leave Glossop up the Doctors gate moorland path. Then hit the Pennine Way at Old Women with a steep climb to Bleaklow Head at 635m 2083ft, then a steep descent down Clough Edge with an easy walk through farmland down the Longendale trail back into Hadfield.
Start Point; Pym Chair car park SK23 7QU [Approximate postcode reference]. This is a varied terrain walk from Pym Chair moorland, with some tracks and quiet lanes, then a steep decent down into the tree lined Goyt Valley, before climbing moorland to Burbage Edge, with a short section of roadside walking past the Cat and Fiddle returning through heath/open moorland and paved paths, to Shining Tor and back to the car park. Total accents 701m 2,299ft
IMPORTANT NOTICE. The walk on Sunday 24th March has been cancelled due to treacherous road conditions around tomorrow's start point. Please check our web site prior to Wednesday's walk as poor weather conditions are set to last over the coming week. Start Point; Car park HD9 2AU (approx location only). The walk follows parts of the new and old Pennine Way, plus some open moorland. Leaving the car park the track descends to the Wessendale Reservoir then climbs a steep bank beside Blackley Clough to Black Moss Reservoir. Crossing open moorland and pathways to the Black Hill trig point and then returning via the Pennine Way across Dean Clough back to the car park.
Start point: Monsal Head car park. DE45 1NL A walk from Monsal Head through Deep Dale then through the steep sided Wye Valley to the picturesque village of Ashford in the Water before making our way back to Monsal Head. Total Ascent 503 m (1650 ft)

Start Point; Bamford Station, Hope Valley S33 0EA (approx location only) We'll climb to Stanage Edge, and walk Northerly over High Neb to Moscar, then over Derwent Moor to Southern Derwent Edge. From here we'll drop down to Ladybower past some of the best views in the Peak District, before crossing the Ladybower Dam and returning to Bamford on the track of the old railway, which was built to transport stone in the building of the Derwent dams.
Start Point: Lay-by on A5004 Buxton Road 1 mile south of Whalley Bridge. SK23 7DY A climb from Taxal to Windgather Rocks before following the ridge south over Cats Tor and Shining Tor before descending to Erwood Reservoir then Fernlee Reservoir before following the river Goyt back to Taxal. Total Ascent 549 m [1800 ft]
Start Point; Meet at the National Park visitors centre in the Castleton car park. S33 8WP (approx location only). This is another chance to experience our pre-Christmas walk, which is walking the stunning Mam Tor ridge, and finishing in Castleton, which is decorated by a fine display of Christmas trees at this time of year.
Start Point: Grindleford Station cafe, which serves hearty breakfasts if you fancy it. There is ample parking on Grindleford Station approach. The walk will ascend the attractive Padley Gorge, then we will make our way into the Longshaw Estate, where toilets are available at Longshaw House. From there we will make our way along Froggatt Edge to Curbar Gap, descending to the village of Calver, and making our way back then along the Derwent Valley passing through Froggatt village and back into Grindleford. We will return to the start passing through the village of Upper Padley, with its medieval chapel.
Start; Crowdon car park A walk passing Rakes Rock, Laddow Rocks on the Pennine Way to Black Hill. Descent via White Low, Hay Edge, Brookholes Wood. Elevation 2,087ft [636m]

Start; Meet at the car park above the small reservoir, on the minor road to the Goyt Valley from the Whaley Bridge road. This walk is a walk with a difference, in that it could be described as a navigational treasure hunt. In the 1960's, the legendary climber Joe Brown was employed as an instructor at the Whitehall Centre near Buxton. While he was there, he devised a circuit to test his students' navigational skills. Don't worry if you think your navigation isn't very good, just join in with someone else and have a fun day out! It's not serious; we're out for a good day, as we always do! Turn up and have a go! White Peak map, (1:25,000 scale,) and walking compass, (preferably with Romer scale,) essential.

This is a walk with a difference, in that it is a circular walk around the spa town of Buxton, but it has much historical interest and some surprisingly good views! Start Point; Meet at Buxton Opera House. There is ample roadside parking, either on or just off the Long Hill (Whaley Bridge) Road or along or just off the Leek Road.

This is the 2nd of walks along the Pennine way. Car parking at Hadfield Stn or direct train from Mcr Picc. We travel from Hadfield to Glossop on the 10.05 train or bus service. Unfortunately due to works on the line a temporary bus service is running from Mcr Picc. (Check bus times need to be at Hadfield for 10.00 hrs) We then leave Glossop Stn via Old Glossop up the Doctors gate path. Then hit the Pennine Way at Old Women with a steep climb to Bleaklow Head at 2083ft (635 m), before descending steeply down Clough Edge, with an easy walk down the Longendale trail back into Hadfield

The walk climbs up out of Castleton to Mam Nick and then to the high point of Lord's Seat at Rushup Edge. We then descend along the Ridge and quiet lanes to climb up the flanks of Eldon Hill. A gradual descending path takes us back into Castleton. Total Ascent 1,845 ft. Start Point Castleton Pay and Display Carpark (There is a £6 charge at this carpark. Wherever you decide to park the walk start is this carpark.)SK 149829 S33 8WG

Then down into New Mills then via the Torrs and the Millennium walkway returning via the Goyt River Bank path and Peak Forest canal. Ascent 1200 ft. For those who wish to participate a cream tea of scones and jam has been arranged in the quaint Tezels Bistro at a special RTG rate of £3
Start Point P&D CP West Side of village. SK216767, S32 5QP. A varied walk from the plague village of Eyam along the Derwent River through a secluded valley with a climb over Sir William Hill moorland .
Start Point Lathkill Hotel, Over Haddon. SK207664 DE4 5HY. (The Lathkill Hotel is at the Eastern end of the village. There is ample free roadside parking in the village, or Pay & Display car park, £4.25.). This is a walk in the White Peak of the Derbyshire Peak district, exploring the Estates of Chatsworth House and Haddon Hall. There is lots of historic interest, set in beautiful walking countryside. Most of the walk is on good paths or tracks, with some short sections of road walking, but please note some of the paths will be muddy, leather boots and gaiters are highly recommended. Dogs must be on a short lead throughout the walk. 1,625 feet of ascent.
Start Point The pay and display car park at Heatherdene on the A6013 - S33 OAZ (nearest, use as a guide only)The walk will initially travel south west via Yorkshire Bridge and Hallum Barn to the River Noe. Turning now generally north and then east we continue to Kilhill Bridge, Fullwood Stile Farm, and Upper Fulwood Farm before climbing steadily to Hope Cross and eventually Win Hill Pike. Leaving the higher ground we now descend steeply to complete the circuit by way of Winhill Plantation and Parkin Clough. 1,935 feet of ascent and descent.
The route rises to cross Taxal Moor and Edge and returns over the tops heading back north along the River Goyt. There are a couple of steep climbs. Start Point Taxal Park layby on A5004 Whaley Bridge to Buxton Road (south of Whaley Bridge and east of Taxal)
Start Point Roadside Parking by the Bulls Head. Along Limestone Way, Over Haddon, returning along Lathkill Dale.

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Description
Additional information:- Train from Manchester Piccadilly at 9:22, to arrive at Edale at 10:08. Return train from Glossop at half hourly intervals This is a walk along the first section of the Pennine Way, across Kinder Scout from Edale. It is a linear walk, with convenient access by train. The original 1965 route of the Pennine Way was diverted to Jacobs Ladder due to problems of erosion. In this year of the 80th anniversary of the mass trespass of Kinder Scout, it is my intention to follow the original route over the summit, assuming conditions are favourable. So we will leave Edale railway station, soon passing the Old Nags Head, (by common consent the official start of the Pennine Way,) and climb onto the Kinder plateau using the Grindsbrook Clough footpath. At the top, we will cross the plateau, picking up the Kinder River and passing Kinder Gates before arriving at Kinder Downfall. Some of this section is likely to be difficult, and may require crossing peat groughs and boggy ground. We will continue along the Western Edge of Kinder Scout, before dropping slightly to cross Mill Hill, and finally descending to Glossop using the Doctors Gate footpath. The ascent of Kinder Scout will involve a climb of approximately 1,280 feet, and Mill Hill around 150 feet
From Hayfield the walk will climb via the Snake Path and William Clough to the southern edge of the Kinder plateau before contouring to Kinder Downfall and Kinder Low. The return climbs over Swine's Back and descends to Coldwell Clough before climbing again to Stubbs Farm and dropping back into Hayfield. 2,400 feet of ascent and descent
This walk is along the Hope Valley from Castleton, passing Brough, Shatton, Thornhill and Aston. There are two short climbs but generally the walk is in the valley. Unfortunately, roadside parking around Castleton, which is free during the week, is now £5 for a full day at weekends and Bank holidays so you may wish to car share to reduce the cost.
From small village centre along quiet lanes and tracks across fields descending into Coombs Dale before then ascending a path climbing up High Rake then traversing a quiet road along Stanage Edge passing through a wood and then over Longstone Moor to the summit. Track descent down into the dale returning through farmland paths and quiet lanes back to Eyam. Some open moorland with cloughs - strong walkers advice
From Whaley bridge ascent past Toddbrook reservoir then via the Torrs and the Millennium walkway returning via the Peak Forest canal.

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Description
Start Whaley Bridge Station. From Whaley bridge we ascend past Toddbrook reservoir. With great views of Lyme Park. Then via the Torrs and the Millennium walkway returning by a scenic walk along the River Goyt and the Peak Forest canal. I have then arranged cream teas for those who wish in the quaint Teazels Bistro in the Whalley bridge canal basin. The costs of a cream and jam scone and pot of tea at a special rate for RTG members of £3.00. Free parking on main road opposite station. Or by train 09.52 from Manchester Piccadilly (Buxton Train)
From small village centre ascending stony track to Hindlow Quarry, crossing field and tracks to the High Peak Trail & Mid Shires Way to the former station at Hurdlow gently descending through rolling farmland via paths/ tracks and quiet lane to Pilsbury Castle Hills across the valley and on up the hillside to the summit of Hitler Hill before returning to Earl Sterndale
We walk through Bradford Dale and Lathkill Dale alongside rivers, through woodland and across limestone terrain. From Monyash we follow field paths and a steep climb in Cales Dale. There is a steep path back into Bradford Dale from where a riverside path leads through the valley back to Youlgreave.
A walk above and to the east of the Derwent Valley calling at Derwent Edge, Sheepfold Clough, Berristers Tor and Abbey Bank. 2,300 feet of ascent and descent with a maximum height of 1,730 feet.
Please note new start time of 10.00hrs. Free forestry commission car park at Crowden . A moorland walk climbing up from Crowden on to Millstone Rocks then over Tintwistle low moor before climbing via Arnfield to Ormes moor and the remote Chew Reservoir then returning along the Pennine Way. This walk in part is over some boggy ground especially after the recent month of heavy rain. So please come equipped with the appropriate boots, walking poles and gaiters .
The walk starts on the Sett Valley Trail to Birch Vale and climbs up Foxholes Clough (420m). This is the only climb on this walk and we should reach the top by morning coffee. We then walk down to Loughhead, over to Furness Vale and pick up the Midshires way and River Goyt to Torrs Riverside Park. We return via the Sett Valley Trail.
A clockwise circuit on the higher ground above Hathersage including Ox Stones, Carl Wark and Higger Tor with 1,952 feet of ascent and descent and a maximum height of 1,482 feet

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Description
Win Hill and Ladybower, meet Hope Railway Station car park. We walk up from Hope along the south side of Win Hill until we meet the old Roman Road taking us to the Old Hope Cross. Then dropping down through the forest to follow the spectacular banks of Ladybower reservoir. We then cross the dam near Yorkshire bridge before climbing the steep Parkins Clough to the near crest of Win Hill. We then walk down through open moorland and pastures back to Hope railway station. Conditions are likely to be muddy so make sure good boots and gaiters are worn. Start; Hope Railway Station. free parking
Start point - Car Park (parking charge,) to front of Monsal Head Hotel, near Ashford in the Water, Derbyshire. There is also free roadside parking available nearby, (on road to Little Longstone.) This is a walk visiting some of the spectacular and interesting places which the White Peak of Derbyshire has to offer. We are starting off at Monsal Head, which is one of the most famous viewpoints in the area, overlooking Monsal Dale and the viaduct of the old Midland Railway. We will be following the River Wye along Monsal Dale, crossing the A6 at White Lodge and making our way up to the village of Sheldon and visiting the old Magpie lead mine. From here we will make our way to Bakewell, famous for puddings, (not tarts!) before making our way on to the Monsal Trail, which follows the route of the Midland railway. We will finish by walking through one of the newly opened tunnels, before a short final climb back to our start point at Monsal Head. We will then have the option of refreshments, either at the Stables Bar or at The Pack Horse in Little Longstone. Please note that the area is predominantly Limestone, which becomes polished and slippery, particularly the path from White Lodge. It is also likely to be muddy. The climb to Sheldon is quite steep, but otherwise gradients on the walk are not too difficult.
