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Description
BOOKING REQUESTED. NO DOGS PLEASE. Abbeystead to Grizedale Bridge, over Margery's Hill, past Luncheon Hut up to Ward's Stone. Descend via Tarnsyke Clough to Tarnbrook. Follow the Wyre Way to Tower Lodge and back to Abbeystead. Risk Assessment: Some steep stiles, top of Ward's Stone can be boggy. Livestock en-route.
BOOKING REQUESTED. Along the east side of Rivington Reservoir, past Yarrow Reservoir to Anglezarke Reservoir. Along The Goit to White Coppice, Healey Fold Lane and across fields to the highest point, Healey Nab. Descending to Healey Fold Lane and along the west side of Anglezarke and Upper Rivington reservoirs to Horrobin Lane and back to the cars. Risk assessment: Tree roots in woodland can be a trip hazard. Muddy patches in wet weather. A small amount of walking on minor roads.
BOOKING REQUESTED. From White Coppice over Great Hill, via Tockholes Plantation and Roddlesworth Information Centre, returning over Withnell Moor and Brinscall Woods. Risk Assessment: Some stiles and muddy in places. Crossing the A675 twice.
BOOKING REQUESTED. From Hurst Green village we head west, making a steady ascent. Then heading north, still on a slow ascent, great views towards the south and east, Clitheroe and Pendle Hill. We pass Dutton Manor and Dutton Doghouse. Passing through a forest we reach Spire Hill trip point on Longridge Fell, looking down into the beautiful Forest of Bowland and over to the distant fells. Heading east, a slow descent down to Turner Fold. Then south down to and past the front of impressive Stonyhurst College, returning into Hurst Green village. Risk assessment: Some slippery and poorly maintained stiles early on. May be muddy within the first few miles depending on weather conditions. Numerous fallen trees to get around. Some walking on minor roads.

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Description
BOOKING REQUESTED. From the car park, north along the edge of the reservoirs to Siddow Fold, returning south via Jepson's Gate and Simms and then across the moor to reach the Pike itself. From the top descend south to the Castle before returning to the car park. Risk Assessment: Initially on very good paths in woods, then some walking on quiet lanes. The central section is rougher, on fainter paths across the moor, to reach the well-established routes over Rivington Pike. Very few gates and stiles. Multiple options for short cuts if conditions are bad.
BOOKING REQUIRED. DOGS ON LEADS PLEASE. Starting from Witton Country Park the route follows good field paths and tracks, passing 'Yellow Hills' (yellow gorse) and continues towards the river Darwin. We may be able to do a detour up to Hoghton Tower where James I is said to have knighted the loin of beef Sirloin. The route crosses Pleasington Golf Course, and through Pleasington village back to the start point. Risk assessment: several stiles and a couple of steady ascents, including up to Hoghton Tower. A couple of road crossings.
BOOKING REQUIRED. Please note start time 10.45am
Bronte Way / Pendle Way south to Lumb Lane Farm then an optional ascent up to Lad Law trig point at 1,700 feet (those declining the ascent will have an extra morning break!) then west to the Coldwell Reservoirs then following field tracks and paths N/NE via Hollin Hall back to Wycoller.

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Description
Sorry, no dogs. From Chipping village we ascend Saddle Fell, cross and slightly ascend Wolf Fell to Fair Snape summit, return via Parlick Hill. From Fair Snape Fell there are excellent views of Bowland and the fells and with good visibility it is possible to see 360 degrees, from the North Wales coast, all of the Lancashire coast, up to Cumbrian coast, the Lakeland fells and numerous peaks in Yorkshire. Coffee stop on Saddle Fell and lunch in stone wind shelter on Fair Snape Fell
BOOKING REQUIRED, DOGS ON LEADS. The second of our Witton Weavers Way walks takes us on a climb from the car park up to Darwin Tower which is in the final stages of renovation ready for the Queen's Jubilee Weekend. The route crosses Darwin Moor on tracks built by miners and through Tockholes Woods where there are hundreds of native bluebells (if still in flower). Risk assessment: Only a few stiles, with good moorland tracks and paths. A couple of short steep slopes.
BOOKING REQUIRED, SORRY NO DOGS. Downham has been described as the most beautiful village in Lancashire, was the setting and location for the filming of the 1961 film Whistle down the Wind. Starting from the village car park we head south passing at the foot of Worsaw Hill before making a sharp ascent up the north west side of Pendle Hill along Burst Clough to the summit and trig point that gives superb 360 degree views over Lancashire and towards the Yorkshire Dales. Descending down the north side we pass Hookcliffe Plantation to Hollins Farm along field paths back into Downham village.
BOOKING REQUIRED, DOGS ON LEADS. Details to be confirmed.

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Description
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. Starting from visitor centre we head uphill to join the Rossendale Way. At various points we will leave the Rossendale Way only to re-join it later. When back onto the Rossendale Way we will be looking down on a set of three reservoirs before dropping back down and crossing over Grane Road and skirting around the back of Jamestone Quarry before retracing our original path back down to the visitor centre.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. From the car park we skirt Yarrow reservoir, ascend Lead Mines Clough to the Wellington bomber memorial, and continue to the Pike Stones, site of a Neolithic chambered long cairn burial over 4500 years old. We then descend back to the start, skirting another four reservoirs on the way. Risk assessment: will be wet and boggy on the moor between the crash site and the Pike Stones. One very steep downhill section which may be slippery.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY - A low level walk, which roughly follows the River Ribble, twists and turns through woods, across fields and bridges. The outbound leg crosses the river at Sawley then across fields to Hell Syke Bridge, Bolton Hall Farm, Fooden Hall Farm, before eventually re-crossing the river at Gisburn Bridge. The homeward route follows the Ribble Way back to Sawley.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. A Bowland classic, 850ft of fairly gradual ascent over 2.5 miles of Oakencrough and Hazelhurst Fell to Fiendsdale Head. Then descending via Bleasdale back to cars.
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLYA walk through woodland to the Rivington and Yarrow reservoirs. The return takes us to Rivington village then climbs towards the Pike before dropping down to return to the start point.

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Description
PRE-BOOKED WALKERS ONLY. We briefly follow the River Ribble, making our way across fields to Gallows Lane, more fields to Longridge Road, before climbing to go through Hudd Lee Wood and past Cronshaw House. the return is via the foot of Cutlers Hill passing to the south east of Dutton Manor, Moor Cock Farm, Duddel Hill and Stydd Manor.
Wood Lane to Fairy Glen, on to Boar's Den Farm, High Moor to Trig Point (157m). Return via Harrock Hill and Hunter's Hill.
Ascending to Dunsop Head [1,400 feet] via Beatrix and Laythams then down Stony Clough to Whitendale to walk above the river valley back to Puddleducks Café!
Walk down to footpaths along the banks of the River Ribble and the River Hodder, using woodland and farm tracks we climb to Birdy Brow and returning via the outskirts of Stoneyhurst College. Ascent 800ft
Using the Bronte Way and the Pendle Way we climb up to the Lad Law trig point at 1,700 feet then return via Coldwell reservoirs, Moss Barn, Germany, and Thorn Edge farms back to cars.
The walk from Barley takes a slow ascent along Ogden Clough to the west of the summit to give fine views over to the north, to the Ribble Valley, Trough of Bowland and the Yorkshire Dales. Then eastwards to the summit, where at the trig there are fine 360* views but particularly to the East, down to Barley and beyond. The descent back to Barley arcs round to a reservoir before walking back through Barley village and back to the carpark.
A walk to the Pigeon Tower and Rivington Moor before crossing Noon Hill to the Yarrow and Rivington reservoirs.

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Description
Moorland and woodland tracks and paths with a couple of stiles leading to Great Hill returning via White Coppice and the side of the reservoir.
Moorland and woodland tracks and paths with a couple of stiles leading to Great Hill returning via White Coppice and the side of the reservoir. Ascent 750 ft
Starting from Visitor Centre we head uphill to join the Rosendale Way. At various points we will leave the Rossendale Way only to re-join it later. When back onto the Rossendale way we will be looking down on a set of 3 reservoirs before dropping back down and crossing over the Grane Road and skirting around the back of Jamestone Quarry before retracing our original path back down to the Visitor centre.
Farmland footpaths, country roads, a bridlepath and numerous stiles taking us up to the edge of the Forrest of Bowland
Douglas Valley, Leeds and Liverpool canal, Appley Bridge and Ashurst Beacon
To be confirmed
A walk alongside Anglezarke reservoir to White Coppice cricket ground via the valley below Stronsey Bank. Returning around Healey Nab and the Yarrow reservoir.
The tacklers trail forms part of the 32 mile Witton Weavers Way. This section includes a couple of short steep climbs and a longer climb to Darwin Tower. There are some rough moorland sections but some gentle paths through woodland.
Generally good tracks with some steep ascents. Haslingden Grane, Hog Low Pike, Causeway Height, Rushy Leach and Rossendale Way.
A steep climb takes us up to Rivington Pike and onto Rivington Moor. After crossing Anglezarke Moor we descend to White Coppice and a leisurely walk back to the start point via three reservoirs.

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Description
Along the banks of the River Ribble and the River Hodder, along woodland and farm tracks, past Winkley Hall, Hodder Place and Woodfields.
A walk alongside Anglezarke Reservoir to White Coppice via the valley below Stronstrey Bank. Returning around Healey Nab and the Yarrow Reservoir.
The final walk of the 32 mile Witton Weavers Way. Some gentle climbing at the start. Good paths and tracks through fields and woods. We will detour to Houghton Tower halfway round where we will have a leisurely lunch (bring own or eat at cafe) and a look around the grounds.
A walk on easy terrain around Jumbles, Wayoh and Turton reservoirs, passing Turton Tower and other buildings of interest. Walk 3 of the Witton Weavers Way
The Tacklers Trail forms part of the 32 mile Witton Weavers Way. The walk includes a couple of climbs with some rough moorland paths. We also walk along woodland paths and in Sunnyhurst Woods. Good views from Darwin Tower on a clear day.
A walk along the Douglas river valley and back over the Ashurst Beacon
Walk description The Reelers Trail forms part of the 32 mile Witton Weavers Way. The walk covers a beautiful rural landscape rich in historical sites. There are a couple of short steep ascents but the walk is mainly easy terrain through woods and farmland and along the Canal.
This lowland walk follows the western shoreline of the Upper Rivington and Anglezarke Reservoirs to reach the wooded summit of Healey Nab. It then continues into picturesque White Coppice village, returning alongside The Goit waterway beneath Anglezarke Moor. On good paths and tracks.

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Description
The Tacklers Trail forms part of the long distance Witton Weavers Way. The walk includes a couple of short steep climbs to reach Darwen Tower. There are some rough moorland paths and others through woodland and Sunnyhurst Woods are more gentle.
Walking alongside Anglezarke Reservoir to White Coppice via the valley below Stronstrey Bank. Returning around Healey Nab and Yarrow Reservoir.
The Reelers Trail forms part of the long distance Witton Weavers Way. This covers a beautiful rural landscape rich in historical sites. There are some short steep ascents but the terrain is mainly easy on good paths across farmland and through woods and along the Leeds and Liverpool canal.
The Tacklers Trail forms part of the long distance Witton Weavers Way. The walk includes a couple of short steep climbs including a climb to Darwin Tower . There are some rough moorland paths but some gentle paths through woodland and Sunnyhurst woods.
Great House Barn car park Postcode approx BL6 7RZA walk through the Rivington Hall grounds up to the Pigeon Tower and Pike before crossing Rivington Moor to Noon hill. The walk then takes us down to the Yarrow and Rivington reservoirs.
Start point Great House Barn at Rivington Post code (approx) BL6 7RZ. This lowland walk follows the western shoreline of the Upper Rivington and Anglezarke reservoirs to reach the wooded summit of Healey Nab. It then continues into the pretty White Coppice village returning alongside the Goit waterway beneath Anglezarke Moor.

Start point - Car park beside the Royal Arms and the Roddlesworth Cafe and information point. Post code (approx); BB3 0PAWalking part of the Witton Weavers Way mainly on moorland paths with a couple of short steep slopes to climb.
SD 823 403 BB12 9JXWe will be walking out through the village of Barley, before climbing Pendle Hill and Stang Top Moor, then make our way back to the start point. The panoramic views, on a clear day, are absolutely fantastic.

There is a steady climb at the start and an optional steep climb to the Pike with excellent views on a clear day. There will be chance for lunch at the Barn teashop after the walk.
Start Point; Layby on minor roads 2 km NW of Chipping, Lancashire. PR3 2NQ [approximate postcode only] Warning - Open Access Land – sorry NO DOGS even on leads. A short lane walking route to ‘Open Access Land’ [hence all dogs prohibited] before climbing up open fell to the summit of Parlick and gently descending across wild moorland to Paddy’s Pole and on to the summit of Fair Snape Fell, before descending through fields and farms, passing through woodland and a sunken path back to the start.
Start Point; Blackrod Station approach road.BL6 5JH A walk circular walk on bridleways, footpaths and lanes taking in Rivington Pike and a folly called Liverpool Castle

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Description
Start Point; Trawden War Memorial, Lancashire BB8 8RWA super walk with a short section of roadside walking to walled moorland pathways before descending to the Coldwell Reservoir then joining the Pendle Way gentle track ascent and Bronte Way undulating track across the moor to an (avoidable steep) open moor path climb to the summit of Lad Law ridge band with moorland path/rough tracks decent into Wycoller Country Park and field paths and tracks back to the car park. Total ascent 533 m 1749 ft
Start Point; Roadside parking in White Coppice, Lancashire PR6 9DFA walk through the village, with a stony track slow climb to the summit of Great Hill. Then following paved moorland footpath across Redmonds Edge and lanes and pasture decent into Lead Mines Clough with lowland pasture land track passing Anglezarke Reservoir on route back to the car park. Total ascent 375m 1230ft
Start Point; Clowbridge Reservoir on the A682 Burnley to Rawtenstall Road SD 830288 BB11 5NT (postcode is only rough guide). The route climbs Hameldon Hill and then Great Hameldon and follows the Burnley Way to Hapton. Farm tracks and field paths return to Clowbridge. Total ascent 192m 634ft
Start Point; Salterforth Marina, Lancashire SD 888454 BB18 5TT. This a great walk for both regular and new walkers, which includes a steady climb and descent with a canal stroll on the return. The walk starts on the Pennine Way across fields and tracks to Letcliffe Country Park. A short section of roadside and quiet lane walking before field/pasture land climb steadily to the summit of Weets Hill, then descending field paths to rejoin the Pennine Way and fields past the Slipper and Lower Foulridge Reservoirs. Then through Foulridge village before joining the Leeds and Liverpool canal tow path back to the car park. Total ascent 386m 1267ft

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Description
Start Point; Greenbridge car park BB4 7DFFrom the A681 turn onto Cowpe Road [signed Health Centre and Free Parking] continue across the narrow road bridge, past the Health Centre bearing right at Carr Lane picnic sign [following the Cowpe Road for 242m/265yds] right turn onto a rough cobble/sett track for 64m/70yds then sharp steep right to the Greenbridge Car Park. The walk incorporates a short section of quiet road walking utilising tracks, paths with a steady climb giving good views over the ravine, before joining and part of the Rossendale Way. Following tracks though open countryside towards the Waugh Well Reservoir then climbing and before descending around Craig High Level Tank. Then following the Entwistle Moor pathway crossing and joining the Pennine Bridleway descending Coat Pit Pasture passing the Swinden + Lee Green Reservoirs and Entwistle Hall, before following farm field paths back to Worsthorne. Total Ascent 400 m [1312 ft]

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Description
Start Point: Hare and Hounds pub. Considerate roadside parking is possible at the far end of the village PR6 8DR (approx location only). This walks passes through the village and climbs through farmland and mixed woodland tracks and paths onto Darwin Moor with great views from the tower, then undulates through deciduous woods and farmland back to the village. Total ascent 1400ft [424m]
A walk through the village and across farmland fields and tracks up to Dunsop Fell, with splendid views of the valley and surrounding hills. Traversing across open moorland before descending Stoney Clough and down the river valley. Then making our way back up through farmland fields and tracks back to the village of Slaidburn. Initial climb to moor and return from valley and over rolling farmland the total ascent is 2155t / 657m. The open moorland is moss covered peat which can be boggy if weather has been inclement.
